Agency Overview

- Part of the Department of Commerce
 - 17 member appointed body, 18 staff
- Vision: MSAC plays an essential role ensuring every person has access to the transformative power of the arts.
- Mission: advance the arts in our state by providing leadership that champions creative expression, diverse programming, equitable access, lifelong learning, and the arts as a celebrated contributor to the quality of life for all the people of Maryland.



Agency Overview

- FY22 Revenue
 - o \$25,317,737 General Funds
 - \$1,300,000 Special Funds
 - \$1,651,600 Federal Funds*
- 14 Grant Programs
 - o ~\$25 million in regular grants
 - o 700-800 grants annually
- Professional Development
 - FY21 238 free virtual professional development opportunities for 8,434 participants



What Happened

- March 2020 State of Emergency
- Effects on Maryland's Arts Sector
 - Performing Arts Venues and Independent Artists felt the effects especially hard
 - In total, Maryland Citizens for the Arts reports
 - Total economic loss of \$134 million
 - Loss in attendance of 15.2 million people
 - Drop in visitor spending of \$79.4 million
- Effects continued through the Omicron surge

Emergency Grants April 2020 - June 2021

5 rounds = $12,126,824, 1,579 grants
```

- \$1M, 125 grants 64 organizations, 61 artists
 - o sources: National Endowment for the Arts, general funds
- \$3M, 222 grants 131 organizations, 91 artists
 - o source: CARES Act
- \$3M, 334 grants 137 organizations, 197 artists
 - o source: Maryland Strong: Economic Recovery Initiative
- \$126,824, 59 grants 59 roster artists
 - o source: general funds
- \$5M, 839 grants 180 organizations, 659 artists
 - o source: RELIEF Act



Professional Development FY20 & FY21

- 273 free virtual professional development opportunities, approximately 10,500 participants
 - Listening Sessions
 - Coffee with the Executive Director (Council)
 - Envision Workshops
 - Creative Conversations
 - Regional Arts Summits
 - Maryland Arts Summit

- The Arts Sector is Resilient!
