


Revenue Sources for Charitable Nonprofits in Maryland




#### Nonprofit Sources of Revenue


### **Organizational Size by Share of Revenue**





### **Other State & Federal Relief Funds**

- Nonprofit Recovery Initiative (NORI): \$50 million; CARES Act (\$10k & 50K awards)
- Paycheck Protection Program: Round 2 in 2021
- Nonprofit COVID-19 Relief Fund (General Assembly/ARPA): \$20 million across 24 jurisdictions (Typical \$10K - \$50K awards)
- Shuttered Venues Operating Grant: \$123 Million; 158 Awardees; Estimate 2/3 are Nonprofits
- Current ARPA Grants: Baltimore City opened; \$680 million
