- Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)

Successful Federal Programs for Hospitality Workers in Maryland

- Direct Federal Payments to workers and families. Continued payments to families. Child Tax Credits
- Direct CARES Act Payments to Airlines helped Airline catering employees, lost wages and supplemental pay. These programs are coming to an end Dec. 2021

Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)

What is the Paycheck Protection Program?

The Paycheck Protection Program is a loan program that originated from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. This was originally a \$350-billion program intended to provide American small businesses with eight weeks of cash-flow assistance through 100 percent federally guaranteed loans. The loans are backed by the Small Business Administration (SBA). You can read the bill in its entirety here.

The program was then expanded by the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act in late April, adding an additional \$310 billion in funding. The <u>Paycheck Protection Program Flexibility Act</u> made important changes to the program allowing for more time to spend the funds, and making it easier to get a loan fully forgiven.

Then on December 27, 2020 a second stimulus package was signed into law topping up the program with an additional \$285 billion in funding and updating the eligible expenses. It also opened up a <u>second PPP loan</u> for businesses that used up their first PPP loan and have experienced a 25% or greater decrease in revenue.

The second round was offered to a wider range of organizations including labor unions.

Benefit of PPP program we have experienced

 PPP Loans to many Maryland hotels and restaurants that recalled workers.

 PPP Loan of \$62,896.85 was awarded to UNITE HERE Local 7 which enabled us to recall staff who are still working. The loan has been forgiven.

Sheraton Columbia Hotel is reopening as Merriweather Lakehouse Hotel

- Owner: IMH Columbia, LLC headed by local developer David Costello.
- Approved for a First Draw PPP loan on April 10, 2020 and a
- Approved for second Draw PPP loan on February 5, 2021.
- IMH Columbia LLC received a total of \$2.56 million in PPP
- In both cases, IMH Columbia reported that it would spend 100% of the combined \$2.54 million on payroll expenses to retain 120 hotel jobs.
- The reopening event was held Friday November 5, 2021
- The Hotel has refused to recall the workers. So far one housekeeper has been offered a job.
