## OYSTER RESTORATION



At the recommendation of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the BPW approved a **\$9m** expenditure of general obligation bonds for the **Chesapeake Appreciation/Oyster Recovery Partnership**. This contract is part of a project to construct and restore oyster reefs in five Maryland water bodies: Harris

Creek, Little Choptank, Tred Avon, St. Mary's, and Manokin.

#### **DNR's Oyster Restoration Program**

seeks to enhance native oyster populations by restoring their habitat. This is one of the strategies for re-establishing a self-sustaining oyster population in the Chesapeake Bay and supports the stated goals of the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement2014 and Maryland's Oyster Restoration and Aquaculture Development Plan. According to DNR, this is the largest oyster restoration project in the world.

#### **Summary Figures**

## BLACKWELL HALL -SALISBURY UNIVERSITY

The BPW approved a \$3.5m contract to Whiting Turner Contracting Co. (MD) to provide design and pre-construction services as part of a project to **renovate and transform a former library** (Blackwell Hall) into a one-stop-shop Student Services Center.

The project will comply with the **Maryland State High Performance Green Building Program**. It will include energy efficient mechanical equipment, water saving plumbing fixtures, and more.

The University estimates that the project will cost approximately \$43m in total and has an **MBE participation goal** of 20%. The University is on track to meet this goal, with 13.4% participation currently.

## **CAPITAL GRANTS & LOANS**

The BPW provided \$13,841 in grant funding to 20 organizations (501(c)(3)s and local governments) across 7 counties as part of the Capital Grants program, including:

- **4MyCiTy, Inc** (Baltimore City) \$245,000 for a community composting facility
- Frostburg Fire Dept. No.1, Inc (Allegany County) \$500,000 for a ladder truck
- United Communities Against Poverty (Prince George's County) \$500,000 for site improvements to the Historic Fairmount Heights Elementary School

The BPW is the state's highest administrative body and consists of the Governor, Comptroller, and Treasurer. The BPW approves expenditure of funds for capital improvements; sales, leases, and transfers of property; controls procurement, vendors, and contracts for state projects, etc.
