# **PIKESVILLE ARMORY**



The BPW approved a request from the Military Department to declare the Pikesville Readiness Center as surplus to the State's needs. This Armory was built in 1903 on a 14-acre campus. Troops have since been transferred and the property is no longer needed by the Military Department.

In 2017, Governor Hogan appointed a Commission on the Future of the Pikesville Armory composed of local leaders, legislators, and community activists. Over a 2-year period of meetings, studies, focus groups, design charrettes, and an online survey with 1500 respondents, the Commission agreed on a unanimous vision. When completed, the Armory campus will be a center for recreation, cultural arts, historic preservation, and community engagement for the benefit and use by all segments of Pikesville's diverse community. # MARYLAND SUPREME COURT BUILDING



The BPW approved a \$135,290 modification on a contract for the design for the new Maryland Supreme Court Building in Annapolis. The modification removed natural gas from the project and **re-designed the HVAC and plumbing systems to utilize an all-electric heat source to comply with the Climate Solutions Now Act**.

#### **Summary Figures**

The BPW approved 89 items, representing a total State expenditure of \$621,402,720 including:

- 9 items awarding approx. \$3.5m to prime certified small businesses
- 4 items awarding approx. \$2.6m to prime minority business enterprises (MBEs)
- 2 items awarding approx. \$1.9m to Employment Works Program providers
- 7 of the items awarded had established participation goals for minority business enterprises, and 3 items had established participation goals for veteran-owned small business enterprises (VSBEs)

#### MD ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE & MBE'S



The BPW approved two items from the Maryland Environmental Service (MES) totaling \$250,456.70. Governor Moore commended Executive Director, Dr. Charles Glass, and the team at MES for **achieving their MBE participation goal for the second year in a row.** The <u>MBE</u> <u>Program</u> exists to ensure that socially and economically disadvantaged small business owners are included in the state's procurement and contracting opportunities. The state has failed to meet its 29% goal for the past 10 years.

## PROGRAM OPEN SPACE

The Board of Public Works approved a request from the **Department of Natural Resources** to commit \$33,000 in Program Open Space State Share funding for the acquisition of 10-acres of completely forested property within **Green Ridge State Forest in Allegany County**.
